## **OHIO TURNPIKE AND INFRASTRUCTURE COMMISSION**

## <u>Resolution Approving the Selection of Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc.</u> to Repair and Rehabilitate the State Route 252 Bridge Deck in Cuyahoga County at Milepost 156.9 <u>Under Project No. 43-17-02 for the Total Amount of \$1,172,387.00 and Approving the Assignment</u> of Michael Baker Jr., Inc. and Geo-Sci., Inc. to Perform the Necessary Professional Services for <u>Constructing the Project</u>

WHEREAS, the Commission published notice in accordance with law advertising its invitation to bid upon a Contract for the Repair and Rehabilitation of State Route 252 Bridge Deck over the Ohio Turnpike at Milepost 156.9 in Cuyahoga County, Ohio, designated as **Project No. 43-17-02** (the "Project"), which provided for three bid alternates where the Bid Alternate 1 represented the minimum scope that the Commission is responsible to perform and Bid Alternates 2 and 3 affording the City of Olmsted Falls the option to obtain certain aesthetic design improvements as part of the project by paying for their additional costs; and

WHEREAS, the Commission received four bids via Bid Express to perform the Contractor's obligations on the Project, and the Assistant Chief Engineer and the Chief Engineer reviewed and evaluated the bids received, and whose report concerning such analysis is before the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Engineer reports that **Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc.**, of **North Royalton, Ohio**, submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid to perform the Contractor's obligations for the Project for the total amount of **\$1,172,387.00**, which they recommend the Commission accept and approve authorization for the Executive Director to award and enter into an agreement with the City of Olmsted Falls to financially contribute towards the project in an amount equaling the difference between Bid Alternate 1 and the selected Bid Alternate; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Contracts Administration advises that bids for Contract No. 43-17-02 were solicited on the basis of the same terms and conditions and the same specifications, that the bid of Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc. for Contract No. 43-17-02 conforms to the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Sections 5537.07, 9.312 and 153.54, and Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc. submitted a performance bond with good and sufficient surety and made a good faith effort to attain the participation of disadvantaged businesses in the Project; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the bid received will require expenditures under Contract No. 43-17-02 that will exceed \$150,000.00, and Commission action is necessary to approve the Contract in accordance with Article V, Section 1.00 of the Commission's Bylaws; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's Executive Director has reviewed the reports of the Chief Engineer and the Director of Contracts Administration and concurs with the recommendation that the Commission approve the award of Project No. 43-17-02 to Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc. as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has duly considered such recommendation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED by the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission that the bid of **Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc.**, of **North Royalton, Ohio,** in the total amount of **\$1,172,387.00** for Project No. 43-17-02 is approved as the lowest responsive and responsible bid received, and the Executive Director is authorized to execute a Contract on the basis of said bid and enter into an agreement with the City of Olmsted Falls to financially contribute towards the project in an amount equaling the difference between Bid Alternate 1 and its selected Bid Alternate; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission approves the Executive Director and the Chief Engineer assigning **Michael Baker Jr., Inc.**, to perform the necessary construction inspection and administration services for the Project and **Geo-Sci., Inc.**, of **Berea**, **Ohio**, to perform materials testing and inspection services both in accordance with the Miscellaneous Engineering Services Agreement between the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission and said engineering firms; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director has the authority to approve such extra work or change orders under said contracts as a result of an increase in necessary quantities, newly mandated requirements that did not exist at the time of original contract awards, or circumstances that would create a life, safety, or health threatening situation or would unduly delay the completion of the Project or increase its costs.
