Job Duties:

- Perform duties relevant to skilled welding, fabrication and repair of various components, equipment, and aftermarket items necessary in the operation of the Ohio Turnpike facilities and equipment.
- Clamp, hold, tack-weld, heat-bend, grind or bolt component parts to obtain required configurations and positions for welding.
- Weld components in flat, vertical, or overhead positions.
- Lay out, position, align, and secure parts and assemblies prior to assembly, using straightedges, combination squares, calipers, and rulers.
- Weld separately or in combination, using aluminum, stainless steel, cast iron, and other alloys.
- Recognize, set up, and operate hand and power tools common to the welding trade, such as shielded metal arc and gas metal arc welding equipment.
