I am pleased to report that one of last year's resurfacing projects, Project No. 59-11-03 from milepost 205 to 209.6 in Trumbull and Portage Counties, Ohio, was awarded the Quality in Construction Award by the National Asphalt Paving Association. Despite a very wet construction season, a tight project schedule and substantial night work, the contractor on this project, Shelly & Company, was able to construct a very smooth pavement with an outstanding ride. The contractor was able to surpass our smoothness specification by approximately 33%. I am also pleased to report that the project was completed on time and within the budget. I would also like to acknowledge and thank our other team members on this project: our in-house engineering staff, the GPD Group who performed the construction inspection, and ACA Engineering who performed the materials testing and inspection. Thank you.

Retro-Reflective Pavement Markings on the Ohio Turnpike's
Mainline Roadway and Interchange Ramps

WHEREAS, the Commission duly advertised according to law for bids under **Invitation No. 4177** for furnishing and applying retro-reflective pavement markings on the Ohio Turnpike's mainline roadway and interchange ramps located in Williams, Fulton, Lucas, Wood, Ottawa, Sandusky, Erie, Lorain, Cuyahoga, Summit, Portage, Trumbull and Mahoning Counties, Ohio (*Milepost 0.0 to Milepost 241.2*); and

WHEREAS, expenditures for the Contract to be awarded will exceed \$150,000.00, and, therefore, in accordance with Article V, Section 1.00 of the Commission's Code of Bylaws, Commission action is necessary for the award of said Contract; and

WHEREAS, on February 3, 2012, the Commission received three (3) bids in response to said Invitation, and said bids were reviewed and analyzed by the Commission's Maintenance Engineer, whose report concerning said analysis is before the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Maintenance Engineer reports that the lowest responsive and responsible bid for the performance of the work under Invitation No. 4177 was submitted by **Aero-Mark, Inc.** of **Streetsboro, Ohio** in the total amount of **\$661,000.00**, which bid is below the Commission's estimated expenditure for this Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Maintenance Engineer further reports that Aero-mark, Inc. has performed satisfactory work of this kind for the Commission in the past, and he, therefore, recommends that this bid be accepted by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has been advised by the General Counsel that bids for Invitation No. 4177 were solicited on the basis of the same terms and conditions and the same specifications, that the bid of Aero-Mark, Inc. for Invitation No. 4177 conforms to the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Sections 5537.07, Section 9.312 and Section 153.54, and that a bid guaranty and performance bond of good and sufficient surety has been submitted by Aero-Mark, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's Executive Director has reviewed the reports of the Maintenance Engineer and the General Counsel and, predicated upon such analysis, has made his recommendation to the Commission that the Contract for Invitation No. 4177 be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Aero-Mark, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has duly considered such recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the bid of **Aero-Mark, Inc.** of **Streetsboro, Ohio** in the total amount of **\$661,000.00** under Invitation No. 4177 is, and is by the Commission, determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bid received for the performance of said Contract, and is accepted, and that the Executive Director and General Counsel, or either of them, hereby is authorized to: 1) execute a Contract with said successful bidder in the form heretofore prescribed by the Commission pursuant to the aforesaid bid, 2) direct the return to the bidders of their bid security, when appropriate, and 3) take any and all action necessary or proper to carry out the terms of said Contract.

Chief Engineer: Thank you. The second Resolution is awarding Contract No. 39-12-01. This is a continuation of our base replacement program. This is a two part contract: Part A was resurfacing of the mainline roadway from Milepost 101.2 to 109.2 located in Sandusky and Erie Counties. Part B of the contract is for the replacement of the concrete pavement of the

eastbound roadway from milepost 95.9 to 101.2 also located in Erie and Sandusky Counties.

This project is on our 2012 Capital Improvement budget. The bid contained alternate bids for

shoulder, base pavement and shoulder aggregate. We received three bids in response to the

contract. The low bid was submitted by Kokosing Construction Co. of Columbus, Ohio, in the

total base bid amount of \$15,061,269.70. This bid does include a temporary proposed temporary

access credit of \$715,000.00. The total amount bid is below the Engineer's Estimate for this

project, and this contractor has performed satisfactorily in the past for the Commission. The

Resolution also contains a provision to assign Resource International, Inc. of Cleveland, Ohio to

the project for performing construction administrative services and TTL Associates, Inc. of

Toledo, Ohio for the purposes of performing materials testing services. General Counsel please

read the Resolved.

RESOLVED that the bid of Kokosing Construction Co. of **General Counsel:** Columbus, Ohio, in the amount of \$14,346,269.70 for the performance of Contract No. 39-12-

01 is, and is by the Commission, determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bid received for the performance of said Contract, and is accepted, and that the Chairperson and Executive Director, or either of them, hereby is authorized to: 1) execute a Contract with said successful bidder in the form heretofore prescribed by the Commission pursuant to the aforesaid bid. 2) direct the return to the bidders of their bid security, when appropriate, and 3) take any and

all action necessary or proper to carry out the terms of said bid and of said Contract; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission hereby authorizes the Executive Director and the Deputy Executive Director/Chief Engineer to assign Resource International, Inc. of

Cleveland, Ohio to Contract No. 39-12-01 for the purpose of performing construction administration services in accordance with the Agreement specific to this Project as previously authorized under Resolution No. 35-2011, and to assign TTL Associates, Inc. of Toledo, Ohio for the purpose of performing materials testing and inspection, with such assignment in

accordance with the 2011-2012 Miscellaneous Engineering Services Agreement between the Ohio Turnpike Commission and said engineering firm; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that Project No. 39-12-01 is designated a System Project

under the Commission's 1994 Master Trust Agreement.

Senator Patton: I'm not familiar with this proposed temporary access credit. May I have him explain what that is?

Chief Engineer: The contractor, if he so desires, can negotiate with property owners somewhere within the limits of the project – meaning from milepost 95.9 to 101.2 – to access the project from the outside owner's property directly into the project. That not only saves him quite a bit of money and time in removing existing pavement, but also bringing materials into the project. It also benefits the Commission by keeping the construction traffic off the mainline roadway.

Mr. Patton: Thank you.

Chairman: This has been the Commission's practice before?

Chief Engineer: Mr. Chairman, we did the same thing last year on the base replacement project, and we accepted the credit on that project also.

Chairman: It was successful and helped expedite the project?

Chief Engineer: Yes.

Chairman: Anything further, Senator? Mr. Balog?

Vice Chairman Balog: The alternate B recycle material – it's more expensive to use recycled material than it was to use virgin materials, is that correct?

Chief Engineer: Yes, Mr. Chairman and Vice Chairman Balog. We have concrete pavement coming off the roadway and looked at the possibility of reusing it by crushing it, bring it back and use it for aggregate base in the project. However, the cost of bringing the portable crushing plant out to the project, setting it up, crushing the material to get it to the proper gradation, outweighed the benefits of them bringing in virgin material.

Vice Chairman Balog: I assume what the problem is short term use; bringing in

temporary plants, setting up, and using it for this project. Would there be any benefit to a long

term location for a crusher someplace along the Turnpike?

We could look into that Vice Chairman Balog. I don't know if the **Chief Engineer:**

amount of material would make it economical for a contractor to do that. We would have to

store that material for several projects and/or years. The way we are approaching the base

replacement program is that we are not necessarily going by geographic locations to replace the

pavement, but by worst case areas. For example, I will be bringing a Resolution to the

Commission next month to award a section in Cuyahoga County, which makes these projects

approximately eighty miles apart.

Vice Chairman Balog: We are not working in one area – we are jumping around

from location to location picking the worst spots first.

Chairman: I was smiling when Mr. Balog made that suggestion. It's a good

suggestion and has been used in the past. If you recall when they widened the Turnpike right at

S.R. 21 and I-80, they put in a crushing plant. There were at least 25 to 30 public meetings, three

lawsuits and a variety of things that took place. We'll have a 'not in my backyard' issue if we go

to put up a temporary or permanent crushing plant along the Turnpike. Anything further, any

other questions? Yes, Mr. Dixon.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission hereby authorizes the Executive Director and the Deputy Executive Director/Chief Engineer to assign **GPD Group,** of **Akron, Ohio** to Contract No. 59-12-03 for the purpose of performing construction inspection, and **PSI** (**Professional Services Industries**) **Inc.,** of **Cleveland, Ohio** for the purpose of performing material testing and inspection, with such assignments in accordance with the 2011-2012 Miscellaneous Engineering Services Agreements between the Ohio Turnpike Commission and said engineering firms; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that Project No. 59-12-03 is designated a System Project under the Commission's 1994 Master Trust Agreement.

Chief Engineer: That completes my report this morning, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Thanks, Dan. We'll move on to the CFO/Comptroller, Martin.

CFO: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I have a brief update on traffic and revenue for the month of January. This first chart shows the monthly passenger car miles traveled on the Ohio Turnpike over the past two years. Passenger car vehicle miles traveled in January increased .6% from January of last year. Traffic was expected to decrease because of the toll increase in January 1, but it appears that the mild winter weather this year versus the many snow days we had last year, more than offset the effect of the toll increase. Commercial traffic continues to rebound with the improving economy and as a result commercial vehicle miles traveled increased in January and were 2.1% higher than last year. This chart shows the total vehicle miles traveled for the month of January during each year over the past decade. Total vehicle miles traveled for January were 1.1% above the amount from last year.

This chart shows the monthly passenger car toll revenue generated on the Ohio Turnpike over the last two years. The toll rate increase that went into effect on January 1, combined with a slight increase in passenger car miles traveled, caused the passenger car toll revenue in January to increase 8.8% from January of last year. This chart shows the monthly commercial vehicle toll revenue generated over the past two years. The toll rate increase combined with the increase in vehicle miles traveled caused commercial vehicle toll revenue for the month of January to increase 11% from January of last year. This chart shows toll revenues for the month of January during each year over the past decade. Total toll revenues for January were \$1,582,000.00 or, 10.1% above the amount from last year. That completes my report, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Thank you. Any questions for the CFO? Hearing none, we are going to move the General Counsel's place on the agenda until the end for Executive Session purposes. We will move on to the reports of our financial advisors.

Mr. Erickson: No report, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Thank you, Eric. Our general consultant, Scott?

Mr. Buchanan: No report, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Our trustee from Huntington, Mr. Lamb?

Mr. Lamb: No report, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Do you have a report, Captain?

Capt. Zurcher: No report, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Captain, I saw in the media recently a new sign about drugs. Are those being erected along the turnpike?

Capt. Zurcher: Yes, they are. They were approved by the Director approximately one month ago.

Chairman: That's a good idea. They'll be at the toll plazas, or just along the roadway?

Capt. Zurcher: At the state lines, the far east and west gates.

Chairman: Very good. Thank you again for your continued work. I heard of the exceptional work you did in the investigation of the tragic incident that took place on the turnpike. I heard the Patrol did outstanding job in dealing with all of the various issues, including dealing with the family, and I appreciate that very much on behalf of the Commission.

Mr. Pakush: Ready for a Motion.

General Counsel: If we have no further business.

Chairman: We have no further business.

Mr. Pakush: I would like to Move that we hold an Executive Session to discuss litigation matters under the provisions of Ohio Revised Code, § 121.22(G)(1). At the end of this Executive Session, the Commission shall resume its open meeting.

Chairman: Will there be any further action taken as a result.

General Counsel: No.

Chairman: Just to let everyone know that in case you would like to leave. You may stay and wait until we resume and adjourn the meeting. We will have a Motion now to go to Executive Session. The next meeting will be on Monday, March 19, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. Do we have a Motion for Executive Session?

Mr. Pakush: Motion.

Chairman: Seconded, roll call.

Secretary-Treasurer: Mr. Pakush.

Mr. Pakush: Yes.

Secretary-Treasurer: Chairman Hruby.

Chairman: Yes.

Secretary-Treasurer: Vice Chairman Balog.

Vice Chairman Balog: Yes.

Secretary-Treasurer: Mr. Dixon.

Mr. Dixon: Yes.

Secretary-Treasurer: Four to nothing.

Chairman: Okay. We are in Executive Session. Again, you are welcome to stay, but there will be no further action taken by the Commission. (Meeting recessed at 10:40 a.m.)

Chairman: Motion to reconvene Commission Meeting, is there a second?

Mr. Pakush: Second.

Chairman: All in favor, "aye".

All members vote "aye".

Chairman: Anyone opposed, no.

Mr. Pakush: Move to adjourn, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Second. All in favor, "aye".

All members vote "aye".

Chairman: We are adjourned.
