

OHIO TURNPIKE COMMISSION

Resolution No. 1-1950

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission has determined the approximate location of the terminus at the Ohio border of the Western Extension to the Pennsylvania Turnpike, and has requested the concurrence of the Ohio Turnpike Commission therein;

AND, WHEREAS, the Director of Highways has made a tentative physical study of that area of Ohio in the vicinity of the proposed terminus of the Western Extension and has reported that the proposed location at the Ohio border falls within a one-mile band which would be acceptable to the Ohio Department of Highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ohio Turnpike Commission approves the report of the Director of Highways as to the acceptability of the proposed terminus of the Western Extension of the Pennsylvania Turnpike within a one-mile band, and recommends to the Director of Highways that his studies be continued to the point where definite agreement may be reached with the proper Pennsylvania authorities as to the specific point of termination of the Western Extension at the Ohio border.
