WHEREAS the aforesaid committee of the commission has rendered its report recommending the acceptance of "Proposal No. 2" submitted under date of February 5, 1952, by Messrs. Max J. Rudolph, Roy C. Carpenter, Donald C. Dunlap, and Robert J. Free;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that upon the basis of the investigations, advice, hearings, considerations, recommendations, suggestions, and reports aforesaid, and especially the report and recommendation of the commission's aforesaid committee, the commission hereby determines that "Proposal No. 2" submitted under date of February 5, 1952, by Messrs. Max J. Rudolph, Roy C. Carpenter, Donald C. Dunlap, and Robert J. Free is the best proposal which the commission has received, and that it should, and it hereby does, accept that proposal; and
