OHIO TURNPIKE COMMISSION

Resolution No. /6-3 -1953 Finding it Necessary to Change the Location of a Portion of Harris Road, Erie County

WHEREAS a portion of Harris Road, a county road, in Eric County, Ohio, intersects the route to be traversed by Ohio Turnpike Project No. 1, hereinafter called "the turnpike"; and

WHEREAS \$1206 of the Ohio General Code provides for the relocation of any public road upon the Commission's finding that it is necessary to change the location thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that the Commission, having duly and fully considered the same, finds it necessary to change the location of that portion of Harris Road, Groton Township, Erie County, Ohio, the centerline of which presently intersects the centerline of Ohio Turnpike Project No. 1 at or near turnpike station 267 + 64 and which extends from the intersection of existing Harris Road and State Route 99 southwesterly to a point 840 feet southwesterly from the present intersection of Harris Road and State Route 99; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Commission be, and hereby is, instructed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Board of County Commissioners of Erie County, Ohio.
