Resolution Authorizing the Executive Director to take Immediate Action Concerning Award of Contract for Invitation No. 3098-C

WHEREAS, the Commission has advertised for proposals for the furnishing to the Commission of all equipment, tools, vehicles and service to excavate and dispose of Toluene waste contaminated soil, located at the Commission's Amherst Maintenance Building, such contract being designated as Invitation No. 3098-C;

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the cost of the contract will exceed the \$250,000 limit of authorization heretofore granted by the Commission to the executive director with respect to the awarding of such contracts;

WHEREAS, the Commission desires to delegate to the executive director authority to make award of the contract pursuant to Invitation No. 3098-C so that such award may be made immediately as soon as appropriate;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that with respect to the award of the contract for Invitation No. 3098-C, as set forth above, if, in the opinions of the executive director, the deputy executive director-chief engineer and the consulting engineer it is in the best interest of the Commission for an award to be made by the executive director in advance of any meeting of the Commission, the executive director hereby is authorized to award and enter into any contract or contracts and to take whatever other action, on behalf of the Commission, the executive director, with the approval of the deputy executive director-chief engineer and the consulting engineer, shall determine to be in the best interest of the Commission, notwithstanding any limitation imposed upon the authority of the executive director under any resolution heretofore adopted, provided that any award made and contract entered into pursuant to authority granted herein shall be approved by general counsel; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the executive director shall inform the Commission of the actions taken hereunder.
